Business As Usual at Carmelray

The COVID-19 pandemic altered the daily life of the Filipinos, but it was still business as usual at Carmelray Industrial Parks 1 and 2. During the Luzon-wide lockdown, a skeletal workforce continued to serve the water requirement of the locators and residents of the Carmelray community.



CALAMBA CITY ORDINANCE NO. 684

MANDATORY USE OF FACE MASKS AND STRINGENT PRACTICE OF PHYSICAL DISTANCING IN THE CITY OF CALAMBA



FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISION SHALL SUBJECT THE VIOLATORS FOR A FINE OF:

- First Offense:** Php 500.00 for the violator
Php 1000.00 for the establishment
or 1 month imprisonment or both at the discretion of the court
- Second Offense:** Php 1000.00 for the violator
Php 2000.00 for the establishment
or 2 month imprisonment or both at the discretion of the court
- Third Offense:** Php 3000.00 for the violator
Php 5000.00 for the establishment
or 3 month imprisonment or both at the discretion of the court

The New Normal: Workplace Preparedness

PREPARING FOR WORK



Avoid wearing jewelry, watch, or other non-essential accessories



If you have long hair, tie it back



Wear shorter sleeves, avoid neckties. Wear pants instead of skirts. Wear closed comfortable shoes


USING PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION



Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth



Avoid handshakes or touching surfaces frequently touched by other passengers



Use the car's vents to bring in fresh air instead of the air conditioning

WHEN IN PUBLIC



Avoid crowded places and stay at least 6 feet away from others



Always use a facemask or cover your mouth and nose with a cloth



Use a face shield or goggles



Use a tissue, cloth or your sleeves to cover your cough and sneeze



Discard used tissues in an enclosed bin



Frequently wash hands for 20 seconds



Use hand rub with at least 60% alcohol

OFFICE ENTRANCE



Check temperature at main entrances using a no-touch thermometer



Disinfect by soaking shoes on doormat with disinfectant



Sanitize hands before and after using biometric scanners



Clean and disinfect work stations regularly



Avoid sharing of office tools and equipment



Instead of face-to-face meetings or events, consider online or teleconference



Provide alternative work arrangements such as working-hour shifts or work from home

WHILE AT THE WORKPLACE

BEFORE LEAVING WORK



Change into clean clothes and shoes before leaving work



Put dirty clothes and shoes into a bag for soiled clothing



Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer after removing work clothes and before touching clean clothes



Do not wear shoes from work into your home



Wash hands after handling dirty clothes and shoes



Wash clothes worn at work



Shower before interacting with your family



Disinfect your home regularly
